REGISTERING TO VOTE

United States citizens who are 18 years old, or citizens who are 17 years old and will turn 18 on or before the date of the next General or Consolidated Election, are qualified to register to vote. Voters must be residents of their precincts 30 days prior to Election Day.

Grace Period Registration And Same Day Registration

Residents also can register to vote at an Early Voting location or at their Polling Place on Election Day. Those who participate in Grace Period Registration or Same Day Registration and Voting must cast their ballots at the same time they register. Two forms of identification are required.

MEDICAL LOAN CLOSET AND SENDING AID TO UKRAINE

The following items may be loaned from the medical loan closet: Wheel Chairs, Walkers, Transport Chairs, Portable Commode, Shower Chairs, Canes and Crutches.

and adult diapers are occasionally available. To check availability and borrow Medical Aid items, contact the Township at 815-726-4781 X302.

Residents wishing to donate a gently used item are welcome to call and check to see if we are in need. While we try to accept all donations, due to space limitations, it isn't always possible. Bustin who runs Sue the medical loan closet recently donated several items from it to aid the war in Ukraine. She filled two car loads of donations!

This was part of a joint effort by Joliet Township and the County Board to gather items to be shipped to Europe through the Saint Peter and Paul Ukrainian Orthodox Church.

Donna Nevels, a parishioner, wanted to do something for Ukraine. She worked with County Board members Annette Parker and Rachel Ventura to have donation drop off locations.

The donations were then shipped by the church to Poland and then transported into the areas needed in Ukraine.

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

We are pleased to provide General Assistance or Emergency Assistance to eligible township residents. This assistance provides direct vendor payments for Rent and utility bills.

General Assistance is a locally administered program which provides monthly financial assistance to persons who do not have adequate income or resources to provide for their own basic needs. To qualify, the individual must meet certain financial and residential criteria, and not be eligible for any other state or federal assistance programs.

In anticipation of the Township requesting ARPA funds from the county, an architect came to draft a proposal for the much-needed facelift and expansion this year! The plan will add 18 dog cages to the Dog Room, and 21 dog/cat cages to the Intake Room.

With spring came an exciting opportunity for a local Eagle Scout, Tyler Humann, to use the facility for his project. He worked hard to freshen up the landscaping in the front of the building and planted new flowers, laid mulch, and added a bench!



A Look at Your Tax Assessor

He is dedicated to fair assessments and treating the people of Joliet Township with respect and kindness.

Helpful Hints on Tax Bill

When you receive your tax bill, please remember to check the exemption line to make sure you are receiving every exemption you are entitled to. If your property is owner occupied, you should receive a General Homestead Exemption worth \$6,000 off of your assessment.



If you are 65 or older you can receive a Senior Citizens Exemption worth an additional \$5,000 off of your assessment. There is also a Senior Freeze Homestead Exemption.

The requirement for the Senior Freeze are as follows:

- Fulfill property residency requirement
- Max household income must be \$65,000 or less
- Complete and return the Senior Freeze Application each year to either the Supervisor of Assessments Office or your Township Assessor's Office.
- Please remember that this exemption must be renewed and qualified for every year.
- Please note that this exemption freezes your assessment and does NOT freeze your taxes
 If you think you may be entitled to one of the above exemptions, please give us a call at 815-726-5466.

Two Question Quiz on Taxes and Assessments

Question:

If assessed values rise, do taxes have to rise?

Answer: No. Taxes only rise because of an increase in spending, which reflects the funding needs of the various taxing districts.

Question

If assessed value falls, do taxes have to fall?

Answer: No. Taxing authorities decide how much the property tax must rise each year.

Please remember the ultimate goal of the assessor's office is to have each property assessed at .3333 of market value to ensure the tax burden is proportioned in a fair and equitable manner based in the value of your real estate.
